Topic	Disposals From Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council, Preston Park Museum
Overview	Preston Park Museum & Grounds shares the extraordinary stories of the people and history of Stockton-on-Tees through an eclectic collection consisting of 100,000 objects. In 2023, the Museum was awarded a National Heritage Lottery Fund grant to improve the management of its collections. The two-year rationalisation project will help reinterpret and bring new life to objects significant to the local area, whilst rehoming objects which no longer align with our current Collections Development Policy. The objects listed in this document include windows, window frames and panes. They are of differing sizes and conditions and have been stored at the Museum's off-site storage warehouse for a number of years.
Reasons	 The Museum's criteria for disposal include but are not limited to the list below and are lifted from our Collections Development Policy. One or more of the following factors are applicable to each of the listed objects. The object does not follow our collecting priorities. The object does not help us to tell the story of the Borough of Stockton-on-Tees. The object is of poor quality compared with other examples. There are similar or duplicate objects at the museum. The object no longer meets the aims of the museum and would be best placed in another museum's or organisation's collection.
